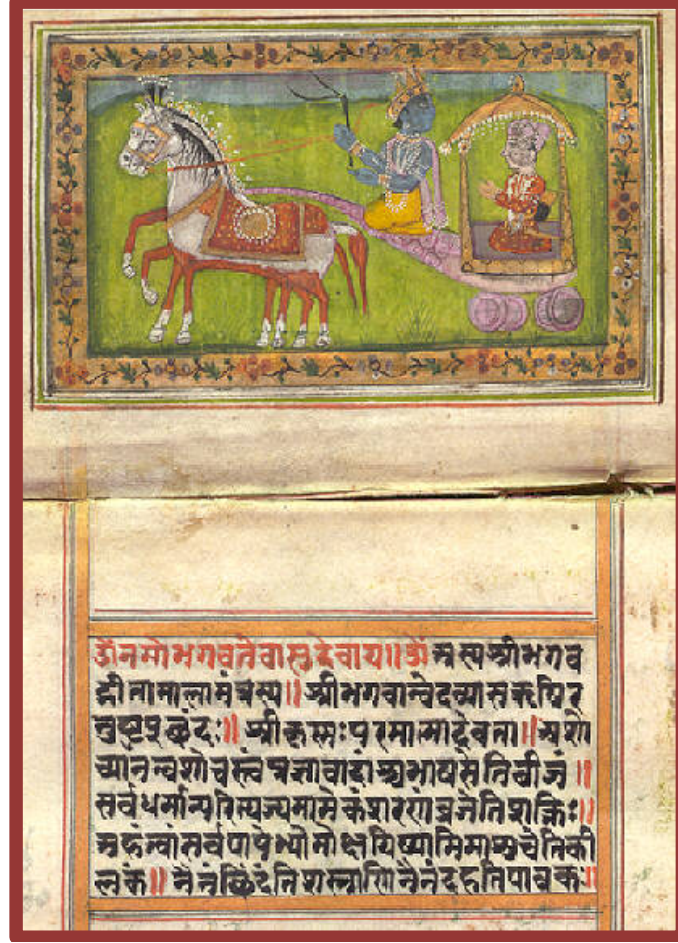

Would you like to learn one of the human race's oldest literary languages? It is still used today. Sanskrit is an Indo-European language, connected to Latin, Greek, German, French, and English. It is the sacred language for many of the oldest religions such as Hinduism, Buddhism and Jainism. It is the language for some of the world's greatest *yoga* practitioners, poets, mathematicians, linguists, philosophers and theologians.

You will learn: the script, fundamental Sanskrit vocabulary and grammar, and how to read *Yoga* texts and scriptural texts like the *Bhagavad Gītā*.

This course also provides an excellent augment to English grammar, helping you further develop critical thinking skills, logical analysis, and English composition capacities.
