

Classics Department Policies for Cross-Listing Courses with Other Departments/Units

Please contact the Department Chair or Undergraduate Coordinator if you wish to cross-list a course or if you wish to have a course in your department count towards the Classics degree program. Submissions must be in the form of a syllabus that meets all the requirements of the UF Syllabus Policy.

Classics Department Policy for Cross-Listing Courses with Other Units

How many seats would Classics supply in a cross-listed class?

Typically, we can list 15 seats per class.

What field- or discipline-specific standards would a course need to meet in order to be cross-listed?

Course must engage with some aspect of ancient studies or Modern Greek history, culture, or language.

Who reviews the proposed course to determine if it meets the department's standards?

The Classics department Curriculum Committee will review the proposed course.

What is the deadline for each semester (fall, spring, summer) by which Classics needs to receive the request for cross-listing a course?

Syllabi must be submitted by the following deadlines: Spring (October 1); Fall and Summer (February 1)

Classics Department Policy for Counting Courses from Another Unit in the Classics Degree Program

The Curriculum Committee will review syllabi and consider the following before deciding:

- a. Does the course need prereqs and is there sufficient access to prereqs?
- b. Will Classics majors have regular access to the course?
- c. Is the interest in the class only minimal, or does Classics need to offer its own version of the class?
- d. Will this course counting towards the Classics degree have a detrimental effect on Classics course enrollments?
- e. Syllabi must be submitted by the following deadlines: Spring (October 1); Fall and Summer (February 1)
